

### A Reflection from Rev. Nancy Nourse

John 6 says... "Sir," they said, "give us that bread every day." Jesus replied, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry again. Whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

When we hear these words from scripture, we often associate them with communion. Of course, at this point in the story there wasn't any Communion: Jesus hadn't given us that gift yet.

Even our forebears read it back into Jesus' words anyway. They'd experienced Christ's Body as truly life-giving.

After all, Jesus had transformed their world...water into wine, healing people from blindness, and paralysis, and skin disease. He fed thousands, and calmed storms, and turned perspectives and

ideals around like he overturned tables in the temple. Jesus could connect with people in ways no one else could.

People speak about Jesus as medicine for what ails us. Jesus as the Body of Christ, a community of faith, the spirit at work in the world, communion when we get to feast together. Faith is believing in transformation of all that is weighing heavy on us. Faith is about being diagnosed, admitted, treated, and released to a new regimen of health, body, mind, and soul.

The bread of life – as our scripture describes - in a way it vaccinates us against the estrangement that destroys human solidarity (and no I am not suggesting an alternative to the vaccinations we get from the doctor; only speaking figuratively). It brings us together. Being in communion with the Healer and all our siblings in faith in the church staves off terrible infections like hate and greed.

The Bread of Life is also a foretaste of the full health of the life to come. Remembering Christ as the source of all that nurtures and feeds us is like take good medicine. The church's body gets well when we find ourselves tending the bodies of others, when we put our own needs aside for the well-being of others.

We might not be together in person yet. But our prayer and concern for each other, and the ways the bits and bytes connect us on Sunday morning still offer us a clear prescription to all that we need healing from. We pray that nothing will get in the way of community and connection to each other and God...indeed the medicine that heals us.




## **YOUTH MINISTRY**

#### NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

The Government of Canada, committed to reconciliation and ensuring that the tragic history and ongoing legacy of residential schools is never forgotten, has named September 30th a federal statutory holiday called the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The United Church of Canada, also committed to truth and reconciliation, is supporting this day as a time to reflect on and commemorate the effects of residential schools, and the United Church's role in this tragic history as well as our role in the healing. Both the General Council and Region offices are closed September 30th. Following this direction, the Board of Northminster has decided that the church office will be also closed on September 30th, so that we can all take time to reflect on the significance of the day.

#### **BAPTISM AND MEMBERSHIP**



Ministries. Northminster United participated



in this special occasion. The theme was "Coming Out in Faith" with guest preacher Rev. June Joplin, pastor at Metropolitan Community Church in Toronto.

Rev. Joplin endured a very public break with her previous Church after coming out as a transgender woman in June 2020. Her coming out story and subsequent dismissal attracted worldwide media attention. Since that time she has become a much sought-after speaker and preacher. Born and raised in North Carolina, Rev. Joplin was Ordained as a Baptist Pastor in 2007 and came to Canada in 2014. She was also recognized as one of the 2021 Woman of Influence for her message of acceptance and love needed by many in the world of queer Christianity.



#### ADMINISTRATION UPDATE

At the AGM in June the congregation approved the 2021 Budget which projected a loss for in the amount of \$81,867. As we continue to live with Covid19 we have been fortunate enough to have qualified for the Emergency Wage Subsidy. To the end of July we have received government subsidies totalling \$22,624, but these government subsidies will be drawing to a close in the near future.

Did you know that any donation that you make to Northminster United Church you will receive a tax deduction for. #### PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

#### Task Force Update September 15, 2021

Since our meeting with the Congregation on June 27 to have a motion approved to engage StonePoint Realty agent Joe Belland The purpose of the Congregational meeting was to pass a motion to have StonePoint Realty investigate the possible sale of Northminster Church and to investigate the possible purchase of a building that meets our needs or to purchase land to build a new facility.

The Trustees and the Task Force approved the Buyer and Seller Agreements presented by StonePoint Realty and the trustees signed them to begin the process. The Task Force held a meeting on September 09, 2021 with Joe Belland of StonePoint Realty. The purpose of the meeting was to give StonePoint Realty all the Maintenance Contracts, Leases, Government Code requirements and a description of the features and benefits of our church building for potential buyers. We also presented various scenarios of what we would like in a new facility with respect to square footage and possible floor plans in order to help StonePoint Realty search for potential buildings that may be of interest to purchase.

We have booked our next meeting for October 05, 2021 to get a report from Joe Belland of any possible buyers for Northminster and as well any facilities that meet our needs and availability.

But over the years as context changes, demand on volunteer time increases, and the type of leadership required evolves. And suddenly that governance structure doesn't fit as well as it once did.

Are you someone who loves details, fine-print and policies, and

how organizations work? We know you are out there! And perhaps you are wanting to help out your church, and are looking for something that is just a short term commitment! We hope you'll reach out to Rev. Nancy and be part of a small group of people to take a look at a new governance model that might work for Northminster. Evaluate the concepts together, ask some questions, see how it works

in other United Churches who have adapted the Policy Governance model, and then tell the Board what you think.

What is a Policy Governance model? Similar to what used to be known as the Carver model, policy governance restructures committees to alleviate the need for a large board to gather monthly. There is a managing body (not an executive consisting of committee chairs) consisting of 4-5 people (including the minister) which offers the accountability structure necessary, and setting policies that give committees parameters to work within. This model offers full accountability and communication without putting heavy time burdens on volunteers that is often associated with traditional board/committee structure.
